Meeting minutes

- Follow up from last meeting, Announcements and Updates on Recommended Key Action Steps
 - Kelly from CRESA may attend next month (911 dispatch entity for Clark County)
 - Protocall connected with PACT, COMET, WISe, CVAB warmline to review crisis line procedures
 - Met with Telecare, Station II, EP re: medical clearance practice
 - o Psych eval is the primary hold up in the ED
 - o Pre-authorization for services an issue and has led to lack of reimbursement in some cases
 - o Medical Clearance is fairly streamlined, crisis stabilization required diabetes stabilization prior to admit
 - o 17.21 house bill allows transport to facilities in addition to ED, Urine Drug Screening (UDS) could be prohibitive
 - Skamania Crisis recommendations report shared today, will have Skamania county specific collaborative
 - Youth Mobile Crisis, start date in September and youth specific Clark County Crisis Collaborative will start then. Catholic community services will start to work on MOU's with children/youth providers/stakeholders.

- Discussion on reported increase in youth suicides in the SWWA communities, per request of Julie Lindberg
 - 1) Data/information to understand actual increase and other clinical info
 - 14 suicides in the month of April, 30 region wide, Feb March and April increase, 6 youth in Clark County
 - Surge in Battle Ground about 3 years ago, Teen Talk and Mary W involved
 - 2016 released healthy data survey administered in schools found that Clark County same as the rest of the state

 - 2) Understanding current or planned existing efforts to address this issue
 - Project Aware grant in schools, ASSIST Trainings (how to ask questions)- 2-day commitment for training, Youth Mental Health First Aid, Youth advocacy (FYSPRT youth Tri-lead), Connect Battleground, front porch meetings, Battleground City Manager taking lead to engage community

 - 3) Develop actions plans as a collective to contribute to the efforts to help
 - Ask coroner's office to be part of collaboration for data accuracy- Aaron
 - Battleground City Council is going to have a meeting about it
 - Data work group and follow up
 - Keep this as an agenda item to track for this meeting, however a larger community response is needed that is beyond this group's function

- Dede will speak with Dr. Melnick to see if he can champion a county wide approach from a Public Health concern
 - Daniel bring back to ACH to champion a county wide approach
- Finalize Charter
 - Approved. This will be for both youth and adult crisis collaborative. Any population specific differences can be named.
- Small Group Work- Did not get to, will continue next time
 - Data Measures
 - Medical Clearance

Next steps/homework:

- Read Crisis data article, next meeting to determine what key measures we want to track
- Medical Clearance- Aaron add rationale for current practices, work group can work on recommendations next time
- Identify crisis system intersections that are not clearly documented or defined with roles and responsibilities (e.g. crisis line during business hours/after hours, crisis line and crisis team hand off, crisis line/team with PACT/WISe/COMET, crisis team and behavioral health providers, crisis teams and law enforcement, crisis team and hospitals, voluntary and involuntary services, non-emergency requests for evaluation, etc.) Future work to develop protocols and document processes
- ProtoCall will follow up with Providers and individuals and their experience with using the crisis line
